There's also news of two new publications related to SF in nursing.


Blogs

New Publications

If any SSFN members have published any new Solution Focused material recently, let us know and we'll share it with the rest of the Network.

Steve Smith and Pamela Kirkpatrick had a paper published in *Primary Health Care* last December. The paper, which explores the benefits of Solution Focused working when engaging with people with long-term conditions, arguably extends the remit of SF nursing practice beyond the traditional mental health arena, and builds on a previous paper published by the SF practitioner group at Robert Gordon University in 2011.

Steve has also had a book chapter published in January. Continuing to develop the theme that Solution Focused practice is relevant across all nursing (and indeed healthcare practitioner) specialities, the chapter in <u>Competencies for Nursing Practice: A handbook for student nurses</u> edited by Reading and Webster is published on January 22nd.
